

Defining One Health


One Health integrated, is an unifying approach that aims to sustainably balance and optimize the health of animals people, and ecosystems. It recognizes the health of humans, domestic and wild animals, plants and the wider environment (including ecosystems) are closely linked and interdependent

(One Health High Level Panel [OHHLEP] One Health definition, 2021)






One Health Priority Programme Area (OH PPA)

A global network of multidisciplinary teams, including more than 350 experts in the field, working to strengthen the One Health capacities of over 35 countries.

Recent ECTAD achievements


(October 2020–September 2021)

Improved diagnostic capacities of almost 90 laboratories in 22 countries

FAO Virtual Learning Centers (VLCs)






One Health Knowledge Nexus

TREATMENT

AMR is reducing the effectiveness of antimicrobials compromising the treatment of infectious diseases.

10 MILLION

The death that could reach 10 million per year by 2050.

DEATHS

Recent studies found that AMR caused 1.27 million human deaths in 2019

100 TRILLION

The economic impact if the problem is not address could have an impact of about USD 100 trillion.

76% of the antibiotics commonly used in food animals are also important in human medicine





Up to 80% of antibiotics consumed by animals are excreted non-metabolized



INTERNATIONAL FAO ANTIMICROBIAL RESISTANCE MONITORING (InFARM) DATA PLATFORM





